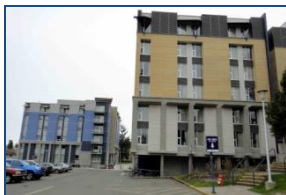


Accommodation & Meals

Classes and accommodation will be at the University of Victoria in Victoria, BC. Accommodation reservations will be made directly with the university. Information regarding the accommodation will be included in the registration confirmation packages (sent out March 2012). Prices for 2012 have not yet been confirmed. Two tower dormitory residences – right beside the Housing and Conference Services Center have been booked. These residences offer bed and breakfast accommodation with single rooms or shared twin rooms. A few of the 4 bedroom cluster units in the Commonwealth Village are also available. These do not include any meals, but do have a small kitchenette available. Book early if you want this type of accommodation! Handicapped accommodations are available.



Meals can be paid for as you go or with non-refundable “dining plus cards” that can be purchased (in \$20.00 and \$50.00 multiples) from the university. Our seminar goes over the long May weekend, the food service will be limited on the weekend to the Cadboro Commons building only.



Our meals and most events (other than classes) will be held in the Cadboro Commons building right next to the residences. Classes will be a 5-10 minute walk from the residences in the Clearihue and David Strong buildings.



The campus is renowned for beautiful grounds and a circle walk takes you past the Finnerty Gardens. There may even be some rhododendrons still in bloom while you are here.
