

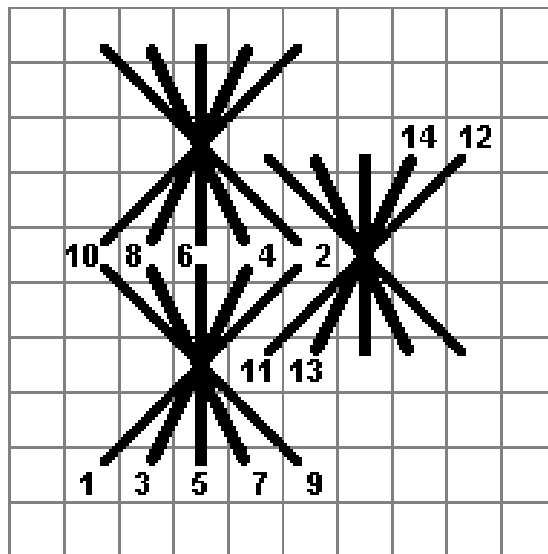
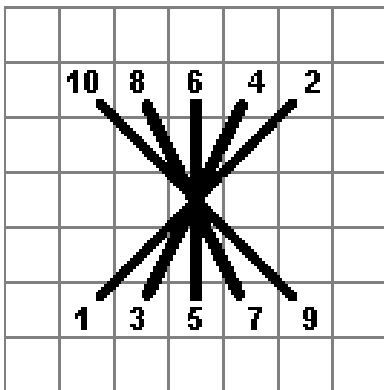
TRY A NEW STITCH

See below for a diagram of your new stitch for this issue of YEN. Hopefully the instructions are clear enough that you can pick up a needle and thread and try it out. If not, ask your leader to give you a hand. If you are a National Member, try to find an older person who could show you.

Attached to your newsletter is a sample of thread that is different than what you probably usually stitch with. It's called Wildflowers, and is made by a company called The Caron Collection (last YEN, you received a piece of Watercolours). The Wildflowers thread doesn't have to be separated.

If you feel like experimenting, try to use a new type of thread or fabric and see how it changes the look of the stitch!

This stitch is called the Wheat stitch (sometimes there are other names used as well). On the left is just one Wheat stitch by itself and on the right is showing how it can be combined.
